True Greatness



What does the word great mean? "Have a great day." "Boy, retirement is great. I'm really enjoying it." "I just landed a great job. More money and a better title." "Our vacation was great. First time at the Grand Canyon." According to the dictionary, these folks had a beyond average experience, one that was markedly superior in quality, or just excellent.

That is a worldly way of thinking about greatness. Christians have something in their lives that is truly great. "Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised..." (Psalm 48:1) God's greatness gives new meaning to the word.

So what is so great about God? One thing is He took a band of nobody slaves in Egypt and made them His people. They were making bricks without straw (a necessary component) and were beaten every day. They cried out in their suffering and He heard them. He set them free from Pharaoh, and gave them a land flowing with milk and honey. They sang in celebration: "Who is like you, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in splendor, doing wonders?" (Exodus 15:11) Now that is great.

But He went beyond even that. He has set us free from sin and death. We have been given "...the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 1:1) We are no longer slaves of sin, but possessors of new life. We have it now. Then, when we die, like a seed that goes into the ground, but possesses life to make it sprout and grow, we still have life in us. The life in us is what raises us at the resurrection and continues forever. That goes way beyond the meaning of great as we commonly use it.

Great new jobs can be downsized. Great retirements can be downsized too, by boredom, health problems, and financial woes. Vacations are not always great. God never changes. "Great is our Lord and of great power." (Psalm 45:3) We can sing a song of celebration of God's greatness with the Israelites, that we are free from slavery to sin and death and have eternal life with Him.
