

We're on the upswing. The numbers are increasing. Slowly and surely since the end of December, there are more hours of daylight than night. We are on the other side of dormancy. We are on this side of life. Even as we still face temperatures below freezing, we are incrementally moving toward the light and new life.

Many take the New Year as a chance to start a new life. They make resolutions and commit to healthy habits. Typically, by February, those habits have long been forgotten. Any improvement effort starts with the best of intentions. You know what they say. Good intentions pave a certain road, which often ends in disrepair.

In my other day job, I happen to coach people on how to create healthy habits in their lives. There are a few trade secrets I've learned. Following these tricks of the trade can help move toward change.

- 1) **Start small.** Often times, our eyes are bigger than our stomachs when it comes to goals. The mistaken notion is that we need to make a drastic change in order to see a difference. Someone once told me, "Whenever you set a goal, cut it in half." Make it manageable. Make it achievable.
- 2) *Create a system.* Make it a routine. Another one told me, "Willpower is overrated. A good system beats willpower any day." Some days it's much too hard to muster the willpower to move a mountain. But if you move a rock each day, you can make a difference over time.
- 3) **Celebrate small successes.** Carrots work better than sticks--in the long run. Honey is better than vinegar. Too many times, we minimize accomplishments and only focus on the next challenge. A little encouragement goes a long way.

Healthy habits don't need to be just about our physical health--like starting exercise or eating better, for instance. We can actually work to build healthy spiritual habits as well. Thomas Aquinas claims the way to build virtue or character is by habit. Do you have a spiritual goal this year?

Consider picking one of the fruits of the Spirit: *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control* (Galatians 5:22-23). Then build a regular practice to show that trait to others. *Start small*—pick one small thing you can do to show love or patience (or any other fruit) to someone specific in your life. *Create a system*—do one small thing every day to demonstrate it. *Celebrate small successes*—honor and acknowledge you are making a difference.

Creating spiritual habits is one path to growth and new life. As a result, more light begins shining in the world than the darkness. It's only natural. New life doesn't just happen overnight. It takes slow and steady, incremental change to embody the new life Christ brings.


