Choir

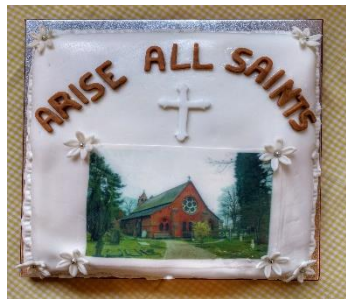

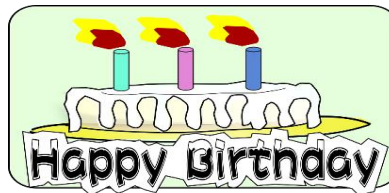
