

First responders know it. Active-duty military and seasoned veterans know it. Parents of toddlers and teens know it. Jesus' first disciples had to learn it. When it comes to emergencies, or combat, raising children, or following Jesus—this same truth applies. *You need to expect the unexpected*.

The Lenten season is fast approaching. It comes early this year. If you've ever observed Lent before, you've come to expect the same message. *"Deny yourself. Sacrifice something. Give something up."*

The Gospel readings this season certainly hit us with these familiar themes—*denial, sacrifice, etc.* But they come haphazard, out of left field. We begin Lent in Mark's Gospel. Then veer off course with some random, out of sequence readings from John. The Lectionary seems near-bent on shoe-horning these expected themes into Lent—paying no heed to story, chronology, or helping fill in the blanks of Jesus' life. It seems a little forced to me.

I don't find the themes of *self-denial* or *self-sacrifice* particularly helpful for my spiritual growth. Maybe that doesn't surprise you. You've come to expect that kind of sentiment from me.

Too often, the ideals of *self-denial* and *sacrifice* have been used by preachers and the Church teaching us to be content with our station in life. "Just accept it. Don't rock the boat. Don't try to change it. Doesn't matter if it's unhealthy, or no longer works for you." They treat it as a spiritual gift (or a spiritual *necessity*) to be miserable, to suffer, and endure—for that is your lot in life. It is your cross to bear. Deny yourself—and be grateful.

But here's what I've come to believe about following Jesus and the Gospel message. *We need to expect the unexpected.* What people bring to Jesus, what they think they understand, it will all be turned on its head. From Peter declaring what "Jesus is Lord" ought to mean, to the Pharisee wondering what it means to be born again. From those who turned up at the Temple expecting business as usual, to Jesus facing his own death. The Gospel is all about confounding our expectations of what it means to follow Jesus.

Jesus says, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Mark 8:34)

Maybe the denial in this case is casting aside our preconceived notions. Be open to what the Spirit has to teach us this season. Listen. *Expect the unexpected*.
