News travels fast—whether good or bad. When the news pertains to any church community, it travels much faster. You've probably already heard my news. But in case you missed it, I made the following announcement on the last Sunday of July.

"It's with a lot of love and appreciation, and a lot of prayerful discernment, that I announce that I will not be renewing a 5th year contract to be your pastor."

I've been in this pastoral role for a total of 4 years now. Before starting here, I was already doing work with a mental health therapy practice in Pittsburgh to help with their business operations. The practice has grown to three locations. As a result, my professional role has grown.

Along with it, a personal relationship has grown as well. My current plan is to move to Pittsburgh in early October for both the professional and personal growth. [Admittedly, one has more pull on me than the other]. In this case, the old line is true. "It's not you, it's me!"

I was very intentional with the wording of my announcement. This decision does come with much *love and appreciation* for all of you. Many times, such announcements start by saying, "It's with a great deal of sadness, that I regret to inform you..." While I do have a lot of feelings about leaving this place and will miss you all truly, the predominant feelings I have are love and appreciation for you.

You have been my family. You provided the perfect place to land to create a home (a Sanctuary really) in the Manse, a place for me and my daughters during a great time of change and transition. In addition to that, you provided a safe landing place for me spiritually. I have often joked that this is the place I could stand up and work out my own spirituality in front of you all. It was a Sanctuary for me, too. And I had a lot of fun doing it. At least, you laughed at MOST of my jokes—or perhaps groaned appropriately.

To be honest, I've not always been proud to say that I am pastor. [Too many people have a bad stereotype of what that means for my taste. Or they have expectations for me to be someone I'm not.] But in my time with you, I've been proud to tell people I'm your pastor. This has been a place of spiritual healing for me.

I've been deeply moved by the comments about how much I've helped you as a congregation. I can't think of anything I've done besides just being myself. But you've allowed me to do just that—be myself, as well as share in the joys and sorrow of your lives.

I believe one of you said it best, "I think you needed us just as much as we needed you." Those words certainly ring true! As much as I've done for you, you've done for me. I am incredibly grateful to have been your pastor. It's been an honor.

My last Sunday will be October 7th, so there will be plenty of time to say our goodbyes. You're not rid of me yet. My prayers go out to those who will be conducting the search for your next pastor. I pray you find someone who is perfect for you. In my prayers, I trust in the words of Jeremiah the prophet, "For surely I know the plans I have for you,' says the LORD, 'plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)
